





School Meals - check


- All children in Reception to the end of Year 2 are entitled to a Universal Infant Free School Meal
- Additional funding is available for school by simply applying for Free School Meals via the Pupil Premium.
- Certain benefits that you may claim will mean you are eliqible.
- Pupil Premium TAs, Thrive, Support groups, music lessons, extra-curricular visits, activities, breakfast club, free milk after age 5.
