On Thursday, Year 1 had an exciting and educational visit to Avoncroft Museum, where they explored the fascinating world of homes from the past. One of the highlights of the day was taking part in a Wattle and Daub workshop, where the children learnt how to build walls just like people did hundreds of years ago—using sticks, clay, horse hair, water, and even animal poo! The hands-on experience gave them a real sense of what life was like in the past. Each child also had the chance to make their own brick using a traditional mould, which was both fun and rewarding. Throughout the day, the children explored a variety of historical buildings including a prefab home, a Tudor house, and a tollgate house. They even visited a privy—an old-fashioned toilet—and examined the features of a traditional windmill. 
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
## CONCEPT CAT
