

Inside the Dome!


Reception had a fantastic treat this week. We entered the Wonder Dome! Inside the dome we watched lots of stars and planets shoot across the ceiling. We then learnt lots of facts about the planets. The children learnt that Mercury is the closest planet to the sun, that Uranus has 146 moons and then they also learnt about the first people who travelled to space and the first people on the moon. We also learnt that hopefully in the next 25 years we will have humans on Mars- I wonder if any of the children in Reception will be the first people on Mars?! The children had the opportunity to ask questions at the end where we learnt that it will take three days to get to the moon and three days to get back home to Earth. What a fantastic experience!
