Last Friday, some of our KS2 Eco-Ambassadors visited Chapter Meadows, a nature reserve alongside the River Severn, to plant trees in conjunction with Worcestershire Wildlife Trust. The children learnt about the different variety of saplings that we would be planting and how these species were the most suitable for the area, given that it regularly floods. There were whips (baby trees) and poplar (fast growing). The children planted over 100 poplar trees, which can simply be pushed into the ground. However, we had to make sure we found suitable plots, with at least 1-metre distance between other saplings, to help them grow successfully. The children were impeccably behaved, worked diligently for the duration of our visit and showed care and understanding for our environment. Well done Eco!
