What you need to do:

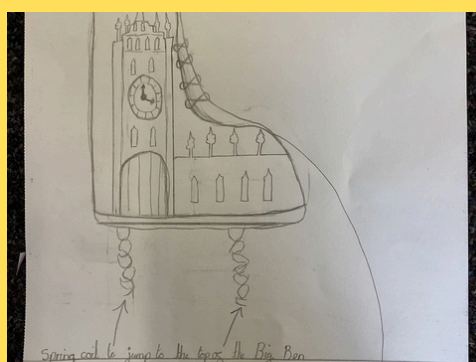
1. Pick your place – Choose a country, city or famous place (it could be London, Icy Arctic, The Great Barrier Reef).
