Year 3 have had a fantastic time on their trips to Lower Smite Farm as part of their Plant topic in Science. Throughout the day, the children explored the question: What does a plant need to grow?

They took part in a range of exciting, hands-on activities, including a sensory walk where they experienced different plant smells and textures, dissecting flowers to identify their parts and explore how insect pollination happens, and even testing soil quality using the “egg test.”

Using LEGO, the children also created models to represent the difference between poor quality soil and nutrient-rich compost, helping them to visualise how soil supports plant growth. They investigated a variety of flower shapes and discovered that many flowers are yellow and white, learning that these colours are particularly easy for bees to see.

The children were fascinated by the wide variety of plants they encountered and thoroughly enjoyed exploring the natural environment. One of the highlights of the day was discovering lamb’s ear, which quickly became a firm favourite thanks to its soft, velvety leaves! It was a fun and exciting day that brought their learning about plants to life.



This week, our Eco/Sustainability Ambassadors had a visit from Kate at Severn Rivers Trust. As a group, we discussed some of the threats our rivers are facing and we considered what natural solutions could make a positive impact. We are looking forward to working with Kate in the future to put some of our ideas into action.
