Congratulations to the Pitmaston Swimmers who travelled to Sheffield Ponds Forge last Saturday to compete in the England Schools' Swimming Association National Championships. They had qualified as the fastest school in the region in their two events earlier in the spring and were representing the West Midlands in both the freestyle and medley relays. At such a huge venue with children from all over the country raring to go, nerves were high but the children rose to the occasion and made it into the finals. They knocked seconds off their qualifying PBs and came away in 10<sup>th</sup> position in the freestyle and 8<sup>th</sup> in the Medley and were the fastest state school in the country in both events, winning the prestigious Presidents Award and 2 gold medals! Massive congratulations to Laith, Leo, Thomas and Pippa for demonstrating such grit and determination - we are so proud!
