Step 1

Step 2

Stop! I don't like what you are doing.



Step 3

If you don't stop I am going to tell an adult.



Step 4

You haven't stopped so I am going to tell because you are bullying.

The Anti-Bullying Ambassador have been trained to give strategies and support to help children work through problems, talk to adults about any problems they may experience and promoting our 4 Steps Bullying code. If you are ever experiencing any problems with friendships are need a supportive, friendly face then the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors are there for you.

As well as supporting on the playgrounds the children also take our assembly in Anti-Bullying week and plan lots of activities to support anti-bullying. Each year we always wear odd socks to promote and celebrate that we are all special and unique.

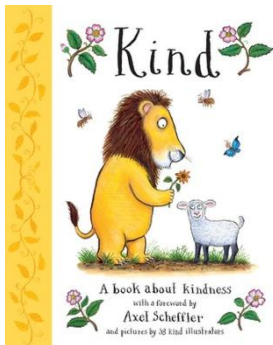
The past year the team investigated books that can help support children to understand feelings and emotions, what do to if something is happening and they don't like it and how to show kindness to everyone.

Below are the titles and the recommended reads that linked to Anti Bullying which can all be view online by clicking on each of the different pictures.

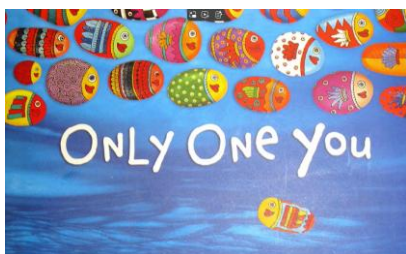

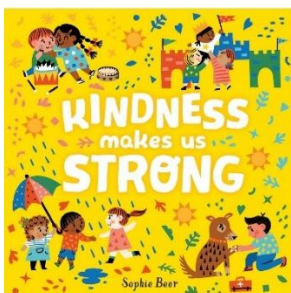

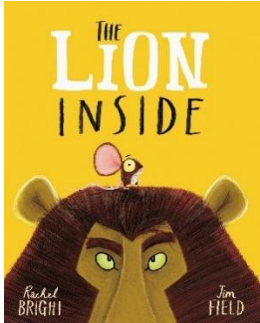

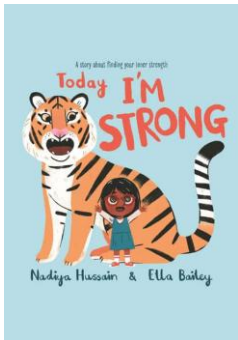

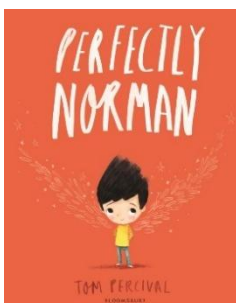

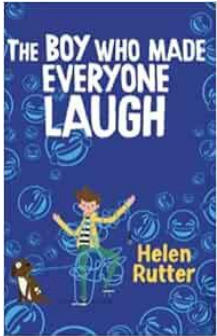

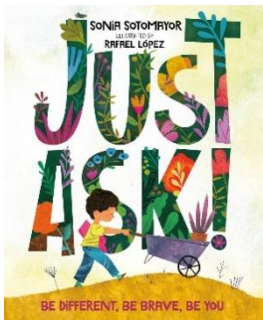

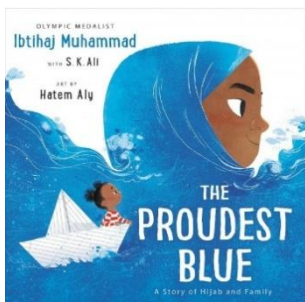
