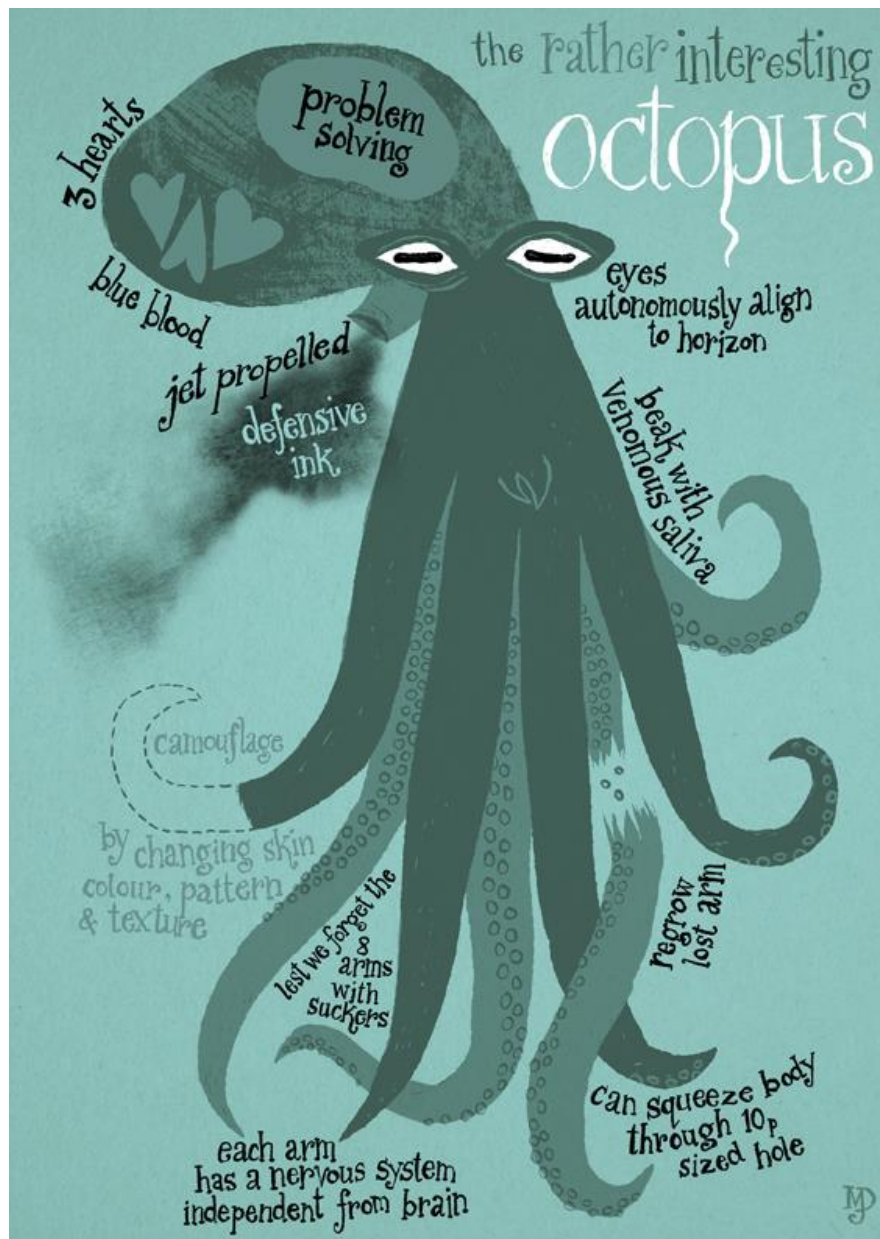
- Who is the old lady?

The Story of the Giants



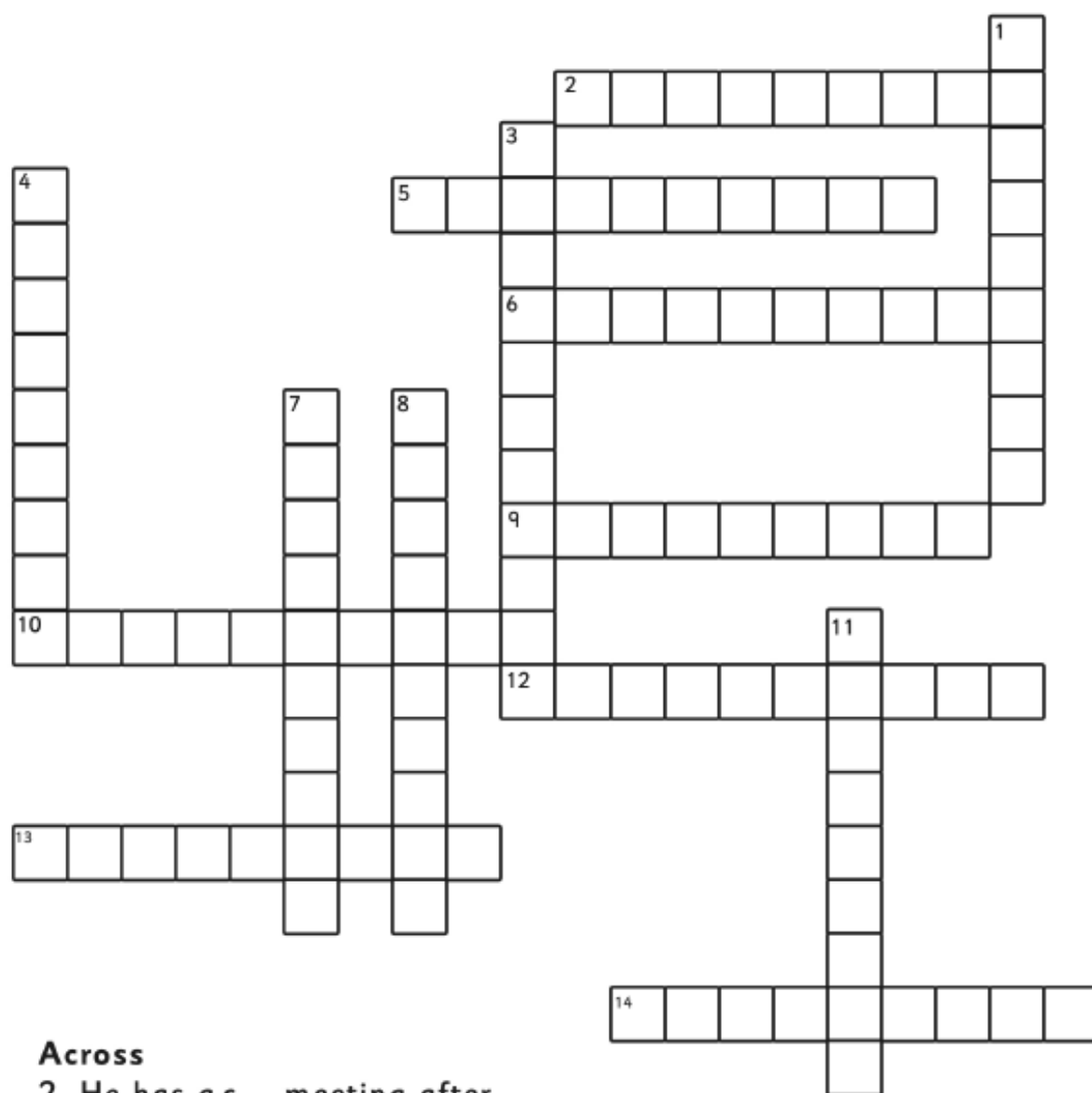
- Who are the giants?

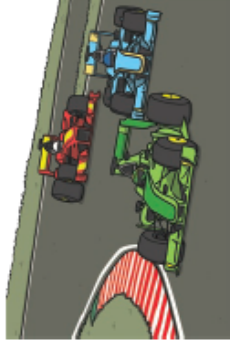
